We had classroom training, bicycle inspection, bicycle repair, and an obstacle course complete with road signs. We had over 100 participants and most went away with more than just knowledge. 
In May we certified three more of our officers as bicycle officers. With the new

The Village of Montgomery is set to replace the remaining four-inch water line on Wallkill and Railroad Avenues. Schenley Construction was the lowest bidder of fifteen at \$356,662.14. The Village will be receiving a \$300,000.00 grant for this project, and will fund the \$56, 662.14 difference out of the water/sewer fund.
