DPW Update

The brown water problem on Weaver and River Streets, as well as Pleasant Avenue and Water's Edge will hopefully be resolved soon.

Street Superintendent Bud Nelson plans to commence a water sequestering process within a week using orthopoly phosphate. After working with the Orange County Department of Health, he is confident that this process will alleviate the problem. The new, ten-inch water main on Weaver Street will also help mitigate the recurring brown water issue. That main is scheduled to be completely on line by December 1st.

Supt. Nelson also noted that leak detection was recently completed in the Village, and the representative from Rural Water said that the Village has one of the best systems, with the least amount of leaks, in Orange County.

Christmas Tree Pickup

Christmas trees will be picked up each week day from December 28th through January 14th. Residents are asked to leave their trees curbside and remove all garland, tinsel and decorations.
