

Single Stream Recycling Rules

PLEASE NOTE: Village residents are asked not to flush certain items down their drains (sinks, toilets, tubs etc.); paper towels, napkins, diapers, baby wipes, other wipes such as Clorox, Windex, etc., ladies' products, cloth or any similar-type materials. These items are commonly found in the Village sewer system and can wreak havoc. Many residents don't realize this, but such materials can cause blockages in the system, which can result in sewer backups in homes, businesses and other facilities. Please try to be considerate and dispose of such materials properly. It will save money and problems in the long run.

Acceptable Items:

- Cartons
- Metal cans & clean aluminum foil, pie plates & trays
- #1, #2 and #4*, #5*, #7* plastic food & beverage containers (bottle & non-bottle packaging)
- Phone books
- Corrugated cardboard & paper bags (flattened)
- Newspapers, brochures & inserts (no plastic bags, do not tie & bundle)
- Paperboard boxes (cereal, pasta & tissue)
- File folders & office paper
- Cardboard beverage carriers
- Glass bottles & jars
- Junk mail, catalogs & magazines
- Loose metal jar lids & steel bottle caps
- Paper towel rolls
- Paperback books

Not Acceptable:

- No scrap metal
- No VHS/VCR tapes
- No plastic bags
- No needles or syringes
- No window panes, mirrors, ceramics & Pyrex® dishware
- No stickers or address label sheet waste
- No plastics other than those listed
- No electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers, etc.)
- No paint, pesticides, oil & cleansers
- No motor oil or antifreeze containers
- No organic material and food waste
- No waxed paper or waxed cardboard
- No Styrofoam™ or paper to-go containers
- No plastic caps
- No hard cover books

Village Compost Site

The Village Compost Site is located at the D.P.W. Garage on Bachelor Street. The hours of operation are 7:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and Saturdays 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. This is for Village residents only and no commercial dumping is allowed. Mayor's Message.....

The new pavilion at Veterans Memorial Park was substantially completed in June. It was used extensively by the Summer Recreation Program. The workmanship on this project is unparalleled. Dennis Matthews oversaw construction, and the finished product is beautiful. The entire DPW contributed, and all deserve a huge debt of gratitude. Frank Polera Jr. did an exceptional job on building the picnic tables that are being used at the pavilion. This new building can also be used by Montgomery Little League, families, other groups or anyone visiting the park. The ceiling will be finished in the near future, and the lighting will be installed by Bob Brown.

Senator William Larkin has procured a grant of \$100,000 for Village of Montgomery. This money will be used for replacing the roof on the Village Hall with rubberized slate, which will match that on the Village Bandstand. In addition, the yankee gutters will be refurbished, flashing installed, old plywood replaced, chimneys repointed, etc. The new roof will last a lifetime, and it will only enhance the aesthetic beauty of the historic Academy.

Work on the 8" water line on Clinton Street, by Walden Savings Bank, will commence tentatively the week after General Montgomery

Day. Construction will take approximately one month, so please plan accordingly. Unfortunately there will be some disruption of business in the downtown area. This new line will substantially improve water pressure in the business district as well as enhance overall fire protection in that area.

Many a family member would be on the front lawn, chatting, waving, and, of course, selling. Due to the lack of precipitation for the last 10 months, the New York State Department of Conservation issued a drought watch for all of New York as of July 15th.
